Share the Pain To Cut it in Half

"Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves."

When I came into the program I was an empty shell. I was physically, emotionally, and spiritually drained. If you had asked me when I came into the program why this was, I could have listed off a thousand reasons, none of them having to do with any fault on my part. My problems were all the cause of other people. The gift that the fourth step has given me is the ability to look at myself, and to treat that self with care and love, alongside the pain and suffering that my self has caused others. The growth and spiritual connection I felt working through my fourth step came to a halt when I came across a resentment I had written very early in sobriety when I was beginning my journey.

"My father may have molested me."

Looking at my resentment stopped me in my tracks. The heart pounding, sweaty palm, nauseous fear set in and I felt paralyzed. My program has taught me to recognize this fear and find a solution, some way to work through it. But how?

It is difficult enough to find your part in a resentment this large, but what about when you are not sure if it happened? With the help of AA, outside help, and my sponsor, I am slowly trying to navigate the road of my journey with this looming resentment present. As an alcoholic I want answers and I want them now, but that

is not what my Higher Power has in store for me. At least not today. This resentment has caused me anguish; in active addiction it drove me further and further into oblivion, and in sobriety I am left to sit with my feelings, a sometimes seemingly unbearable task.

A wise person once said, "If you share your pain you cut it in half, if you don't you double it." The program of Alcoholics Anonymous has given me the opportunity to cut my pain in half, and then that pain in half, and in half again. The more I share this pain with others, the more support I receive, the less daunting this pain feels.


District 10 Presents: Rock 'n' BBQ SoberFest 2015.
