The God Word submitted by George H.

What does the word "God" mean to me?

I had some "old ideas" about what the word God meant to me when I first came into the fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous. It was a word that represented some far away deity, who was not very interested in me and "my little plans and designs." To me, this figure was represented in my mind as the proverbial "old man with a beard" and he was here to "help" me by judging my actions and thoughts and then punishing when what I did think or do fell below some seemingly unattainable standard written in ancients texts. A scorecard was also being tallied, and those who kept free from the "unsat" behavior and thinking would be rewarded later after they passed from this world. By those standards, I knew I was screwed. But the fellowship of AA told me collectively that I could have my own idea of what this Higher Power was. I didn't have to rely on my own misunderstanding of God.

So, initially, I used the fellowship as a Higher Power (H.P.) – the AA group was larger than me, and there was collective wisdom and a feeling of safety of being connected with the members. I also dabbled with the idea of Mother Nature as God, since this also seemed much larger than me and tended to dictate the time I would spend outside in nature, winter or summer. So, I puttered in the "Buffet style", or "casual", search for H.P. for many years. I did take suggestions, like praying when there was a big decision to be made, or for asking the Power to keep me sober in the morning (and subsequently thanking this Power at night), but it wasn't a daily seeking, and although sober (having had the desire to drink or use lifted out of me), I was still acting out in other ways (food, work, exercise, anger, serial relationships, etc.) – anyway that I could use and get some relief in my life. You see, I was still very dissatisfied in many ways. I had been feeling increasingly that there was something missing in my life, and needed something to change.

Turns out, what I really needed to change was me. And this I did from an in depth working of the 12 steps. By being led through the steps by someone who previously been led through the steps in a similar fashion, I had the requisite change of mind, and of heart of which there was no question. As a result my conception of the word God has been completely altered in what the word means and most importantly how the Power works in my daily life. Not only am I willing to go along with the word "God" as it is written in the Big Book, but I have the "daily reprieve" as long as I keep my self clean and clear by using the tools I've discovered that are contained in the steps. And that is what I aim to do each day, to be in the state to receive whatever guidance I can to the best of my understanding, and then carry out this vision (or lack of vision) each day to the best of my ability.

So I've effectively gotten over my 25 year resentment about the word God. All it took for me is willingness, action and the loving guidance of someone who had been there before. Today, I don't "bristle with antagonism" when someone use the word "God" at meetings in reference to the Power... I think it's the same Power that has helped my immeasurably!
